

Television, radio, nursing call system, reading light and mobile phones

Near the bed are a number of facilities such as a radio, a television, a reading light and a system with which a nurse can be called.

Calling the nurse

Press the red button above the telephone. The red light will shine brightly. This will give the nurse a warning.

Headphone

Radio and television can only be heard via a headphone. You can bring a headphone or buy one at the shop in the central hall. If the shop is closed the headphones can be obtained from reception.

Listening to the radio

- Connect the headphone set to the symbol 



- Turn the radio on by pressing the button 
- Regulate the volume by pressing  
- Select a channel by pressing  

- Turn the radio off by pressing the button again 

Watching TV

- Connect the headphone set to the symbol 
- Turn the television on by pressing the button 
- Regulate the volume by pressing  
- Select a channel by pressing  
- For teletext press 
- Use the telephone numbers to select a page.
- Turn the TV off by pressing again

Turn the lights on or off by pressing 

Channels

Television: You can access dozens of national and international channels. The hospital broadcaster, 'Radio Tulipa TV', broadcasts on channel 1 with news provided by and about the hospital. You can also listen to Sky Radio via this channel.

Radio: You can tune into national stations and a number of international stations. You can also listen to Radio Tulipa TV for requests for favourite songs.

Problems/malfunction

Please inform the nurse if you have problems using the television.

Mobile phones

The use of mobile phones is allowed in Amstelland Hospital, but not in all places

or at all times. Switch off your phone in the following situations:

- Wherever you are instructed to do so. In such places phones can disrupt medical apparatus.
- During conversations/contact moments with care providers.
- In patient rooms during ward rest periods, after 22:00 hours and before 08:00 hours in the morning.
- If the staff ask you to do so.

We also ask you to make sure your phone is in the 'silent' mode and to avoid causing noise pollution by not talking too loudly.
